CAMPUS SECURITY PROCEDURES

September 2013

for distribution to students and employees

(A) Campus crime reporting procedures: Any student or employee who observes a crime should immediately notify one of the two nearest police stations at: (1) 71st Precinct – 421 Empire Blvd. Brooklyn NY 718 735-0511 (2) 77th Precinct - 127 Utica Avenue, Brooklyn, NY 718 735-0611. Their phone numbers are (718) 735-0611 and (718) 735-0511. In addition, in the event of any threatening event (e.g. bomb threat, suspected criminal, suspicious character on premises, etc.) the person who observes the danger should carefully and quietly notify the senior administrative staff member in the building so that all students and employees can be notified and advised what precautions to take, while avoiding panic.

All crimes should be brought to the attention of Mordechai Bronchtain who serves as a liaison with local police in coordinating information and keeping students informed. Pertinent crime information will be publicly announced to the student body within 24 hours of a crime.

(B) Policies on access to facilities: Access to all school facilities is restricted to students, employees and authorized visitors who are approved by the school administration. All buildings are to be securely locked after programs and study sessions have ended. After-hours, student access is provided by contacting appointed employees and/or students.

(C) Current campus law enforcement policies: Students are reminded of their responsibility for the welfare of their fellow students. All students and employees who observe a dangerous or suspect situation are expected to communicate with local police immediately. Numbers are listed above. In addition, the Seminary has contracted with Security Resources Inc. to provide on-site security. Mr. Tom Ortiz is the contact person and they can be reached at 212 748-1173 x 226.

(D) Availability of on and off campus counseling and mental health services for crime victims: Counseling is available on campus and is provided by faculty and administration members. In addition, counselors with special training in the counseling field are available to students through Clinic Plus – Jewish Board of Family Children’s Services (JBFCS) 718-676-4200.

(E) Policies for preparing the annual disclosure of crime statistics: The institution annually discloses crime statistics to students and employees. The statistics are compiled by the institution in conjunction with the local police station.

(F) Programs to educate students and employees about campus security procedures: Students are expected to read all the security materials carefully, and to adhere to all policies.

(G) Programs to educate students and employees about crime prevention: Students are required to participate in the time-to-time presentations by the police department and other recognized public safety authorities. Students are expected to observe rudimentary precautions, such as traveling in groups after dark and in high crime areas.

(H) Policy regarding police monitoring of crime at recognized off-campus organizations: There are no authorized off-campus organizations.

(I) Substance abuse policy: See attached Drug and Alcohol policy.

(J) Campus policy regarding sexual assault: Talmudical Seminary Oholei Torah is fully committed to maintaining a safe and secure environment for all students. Accordingly, the school adheres to a strict no-tolerance policy with regard to sex offenses.

In the event a student witnesses a sex offense, they are urged to contact the police immediately. The two nearest police station are: (1) 71st Precinct – 421 Empire Blvd. Brooklyn NY 718 735-0511 (2) 77th Precinct-127 Utica Avenue, Brooklyn, NY 718 735-0611.

Victims of sex crimes are directed to contact the District Attorney's office. In Brooklyn, the Kings County District Attorney's Office has set up a special culturally-sensitive project called Kol Tzedek. Their confidential hotline is 718-250-3000. This is a dedicated hotline and is answered by culturally sensitive social workers and legal staff. Should such an assault occur, it is important for the student to preserve all evidence as proof of a criminal offense.

If a student does not feel comfortable contacting the police or District Attorney directly, they should contact the school's police liaison, Mordechai Bronchtain, who will assist with the proper referrals.

Confidential counseling for victims of sex offenses is available through Clinic Plus – Jewish Board of Family Children's Services (JBFCS) 718-676-4200.

Tamudical Seminary Oholei Torah will change a victim's academic and living situation after the alleged sex offense if changes are requested by the victim and are reasonably available.

Any student who is found guilty of a sex offense, will immediately be expelled from the institution.

There is no due process involved, and no appeal will be accepted. Attendance at our institution is a privilege, not a right, and may be withdrawn without notice if the student is deemed a threat to the safety and security of the student body.

(K) Emergency evacuation procedures: In the event of an emergency, an alarm sounds throughout the entire building, classrooms, study area and restrooms. Students are instructed to evacuate the premises as posted and meet at the designated emergency evacuation site upon hearing the alarm.

(L) Other emergency procedures: If an emergency or threat requires that students remain in the building and that the building remains securely locked, Lockdown Procedures will go into effect securing the building and students from any outside threat.
